- > Gendered and socio-economic inequalities: How these factors shape reproductive choices and trajectories.
- > Late and latest-late fertility: Unique challenges of delayed parenthood.
- > Social narratives and reproductive paths: The impact of prevailing discourses on parenthood.
- Welfare systems and healthcare: The role of policies in supporting or hindering parental wellbeing.
